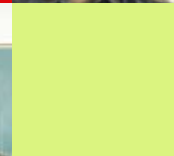

What is multiple sclerosis?

Multiple sclerosis (MS) is an unpredictable, often disabling disease of the central nervous system which is composed of the brain and spinal cord. The disease attacks the myelin which is a protective covering wrapped around the nerves of the central nervous system.

In general, it strikes people who are between 15 and 40 years old. It is the most common neurological disease among young adults in Canada.

There are between 55,000 and 75,000 Canadians living with this disease.

The disease evolves over a fairly long period and is characterized either by flare-ups followed by remissions, or by a slow progression.

Symptoms may include extreme fatigue, speech and visual problems, shaking, loss of balance, numbness, and sometimes even paralysis. These symptoms are unpredictable and may vary from one person to another.

Researchers are trying to identify the cause of MS in order to find a cure as soon as possible.

Every year, the Multiple Sclerosis Society of Canada funds about thirty MS research projects for a total of more than \$10 million.
